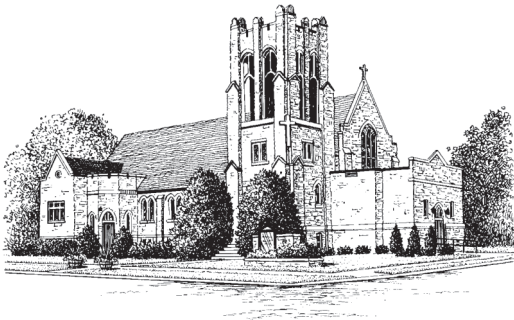

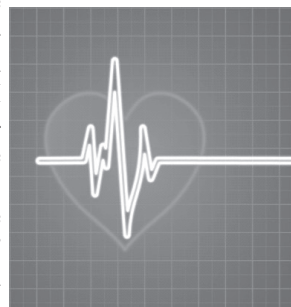

### *Getting to the Heart of It*

This month, instead of writing on a church subject, I am writing this article about a recent change in my health. In mid-January I began to notice that I was getting short of breath while doing some of the easiest, routine things. I really noticed it, for instance, when going up the stairs to the church balcony when the choir or handbells performed. I would get light headed. That seemed unusual and excessive all of a sudden. At first I attributed this to a mid-winter, post-Christmas sluggishness, but when it continued I decided to do the “un-manly” thing and see a doctor.

Long story short, a few tests later and I have been diagnosed with “dilated cardiomyopathy.” That’s a big term for a weakened and enlarged heart. An EKG revealed an irregularity called a “left bundle branch block,” an electrical irregularity affecting the left ventricle of my heart, which has put a strain on the entire heart muscle. So my heart has been working harder than normal but also less efficiently than normal, so it has been weakened.

The cardiologist says that the cause in my case falls into the category of “we don’t know,” and there is no way to tell how long this has been coming. The condition may have a hereditary element, which adds to some of my anxiety. My father died of a heart attack at a younger age than I am now.



The treatment at the moment is to take medication (an ace-inhibitor and a beta-blocker) that enlarges the blood vessels, allowing the blood to flow easier and reducing the pressure on the heart. After the doctor has studied the test results further a heart catheterization may be in order if he determines that he needs to take a closer look for coronary artery blockage. There is also the likelihood of implanting a defibrillator to regulate my heartbeat. Along with these, of course, there are lifestyle changes—primarily drop a few pounds and change my activities to avoid strenuous, heavy lifting.

Now all of this could have stayed a personal matter (and being intensely private I would have much preferred it), except that there is the possibility that my heart condition will impact my work as pastor. Depending on how quickly and successfully the treatment affects this condition, there may or may not be any impact on my work. Over the next few months I’ll have to wait and see whether the cardiomyopathy adversely affects my work, or whether the pace and demands of my work adversely affect my heart recovery. There is no way to know in advance. I have already spoken with the Board of Elders about this, and will continue to keep them apprised as the weeks and months reveal what sort of progress I make with the treatment.

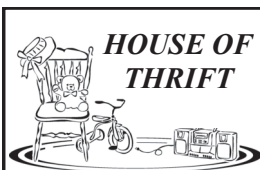
The season of Lent, with its extra services, will be a good test period, both physically and emotionally. For now, except

With some prudent planning and with worship assistance from Deacon Schroeder, I should meet the demands of my work for the near future. Other than that, we'll have to wait and see.

Dear Members

Ash Wednesday snuck in toward the end of February, so now that it's March we are well into Lent, the season of repentance and prayer and reflection. And you might say it takes on a somber tone as we focus on the suffering and death of our Lord. The liturgical color of Lent is violet and you will also notice that we leave out any Alleluias that appear in the liturgy.

But did you know that this year, as often happens, the Lenten season is interrupted by the Feast of the Annunciation? This feast is always on March 25 but we don't always catch it except when, like this year, the 25th of March is a Sunday. (It's one of those feasts that usually falls on a weekday, so we don't celebrate it with the Divine Service or Matins or Vespers.)

In this feast, we celebrate the angel Gabriel announcing to Mary that she will give birth to the Son of God, as recorded in Luke 1:26-38. The liturgical color for this feast is white. If a congregation does formally celebrate this feast, you change the paraments (and stoles) from violet to white, and treat the day as if it is NOT during Lent (sing the Alleluias, don't omit them, etc.), although some debate exists that you SHOULD treat it like Lent (omit Alleluias, keep the violet paraments and vestments).



The Ancient Church believed that Christ was crucified on March 25, and there is an old tradition from antiquity that prophets died on the date they were conceived. Christ Jesus, being a Prophet (Priest, and King), the early church applied this thinking to Good Friday, so that both Good Friday and the Annunciation were March 25. (On a related note, what's nine months after March 25? December 25. Therefore, the church celebrating the Nativity in December probably has nothing to do with paganism or the winter solstice.) The "problem" is that Easter is a "movable" holiday; Easter governs when Ash Wednesday falls, Good Friday falls, and everything in between, so that Easter is always a Sunday, Good Friday is always a Friday, etc. Good Friday is movable but the Annunciation is not.

Here's the catch. As mentioned above, the 25th is a Sunday this year, so do we celebrate the feast of the Annunciation or the Fifth Sunday in Lent? I think we're going with the tradition of bumping the Annunciation to the 26th, allowing the 25th to just be the 5th Sunday in Lent (although there may be a petition during the Prayer of the Church that acknowledges the Annunciation).

This is another topic where I could go on and on, so here's the take-home point: our penitential season in which we anticipate Christ's suffering and death on our behalf (looking toward the Cross) is to be interrupted for one day, allowing us to celebrate the beginning of St. Mary's pregnancy and to begin anticipating the birth of our Savior (looking toward the Star and the Manger). Alleluia!

## Make a Snack to Share With a Friend

### You will need:

- 🥣 large bowl
- 🥣 small bowl
- 🥄 spoon
- 🍴 fork
- 🥣 4 cups toasted oat cereal

- 🥄 1/4-cup margarine

The February 14, 2012 St. Peter's Church Council meeting was called to order by President Bill Steffenhagen at 6:38 P.M.. Members present were Tom Crum, Greg Frank, Steve Hustad, Greg Latzig, Mark Manke, Marv Manke, Verna Mueller, Keith Podoll, Shannon Rohrbeck, Stephen Saager, Jennifer See, Elizabeth Hutchinson, Lynnette Taylor, Mary Witt, Brad Zimmerman, Pastor Hendrickson, and Deacon Schroeder. Tom Daugherty and Michael Post were excused. Glenn Puntney and Sandra Sandstrom were absent.

Opening devotion was given by Deacon Schroeder from the Treasury of Daily Prayer. Following the devotion new council members were introduced. Lynnette Taylor asked for council members e-mail addresses so that they can be informed of the meeting agendas and any other communications that are necessary.

The agenda was Presented. Keith Podoll moved to accept the agenda, Marv Manke seconded and the motion carried.


