

Fourteenth Sunday after Trinity

Sir, we wish to see Jesus! (John 12:21). Then look to His Holy Cross. For just as Moses lifted up the bronze serpent in the wilderness, so Jesus, when He is lifted up from the earth, will draw all people to Himself (v. 32). He humbled Himself and became obedient even to the death of the cross to save us (Phil. 2:8). The true Holy Cross is lost to history, and we cannot return to Calvary to find our salvation. So Christ brings the New Testament in His Blood to us. We find the fruit and benefit of this Holy Cross poured out in Holy Baptism, spoken in the preaching of Holy Absolution, and delivered in the Body and Blood given and shed there for us. Thus are we strengthened to take up our crosses, sanctified by His (John 12:25-26).

(As a prayer of preparation use one of today's hymns the prayers inside the front cover of the hymnal.)

WELCOME GUESTS. The right hand of God is not bound to one location! It is the right hand of Him who fills all things. The ascension means that God now fills all things, remaining true God and true man. For He is now present with us with His very body and blood in the Lord's Supper as He promised. MIDWEEK CLASSES will begin the 2020-2021 year Wednesday September 16th for 5th-8th grade. This year we will overview the Bible and its history, from Genesis to Revelation, beginning with how we got the Bible. All while learning the Small Catechism and making connection to our faith.

BIBLE STUDY resumes next week in the classroom next to the upstairs kitchen. This fall we will take a look at the book of Amos. This prophetic book begins with an earthquake, a shake up for God's people and a reestablishing of His kingdom. Israel, in the book Amos, experiences ecological and natural disasters in the midst of an absence of justice and righteousness but shows mercy triumphing over judgement that leads to our new paradise. Join us as we delve into this great Old Testament book that has great application for us today!

HOLY CROSS DAY, September 14: The origins of this festival are found in the early decades of the fourth century, when St. Helena, mother of Emperor Constantine, undertook an archeological search for the cradle of Christianity within the city of Jerusalem. That holy city had been rebuilt under the Roman Empire following its destruction in the first century (as our Lord Jesus had prophesied). While some of the details cannot be established with absolute certainty, there are various reliable witnesses to the basic facts of the case. The presumed sites of our Lord's crucifixion and burial were uncovered, dug out from under the rubble of Jerusalem's destruction. Tradition says that three crosses were discovered in this process, and one of these three was presumed to be the cross on which Christ Jesus Himself had been crucified. This was in September of a.d. 320.
