Reformation (observed)

"Then I saw another angel flying directly overhead, with an eternal gospel to proclaim to those who dwell on earth." During the Reformation this text was used to refer to Luther's ministry and the Lutheran message: we have an eternal Gospel to proclaim. Christ has freed us from our sins without any works on our part. We are saved by grace alone. And, ironically enough, Luther said this should make him the "apostle of works" because once we are freed by grace, we are truly free to serve God in works that flow from thankfulness and praise.

(As a prayer of preparation use one of today's hymns the prayers inside the front cover of the hymnal.)

WELCOME GUESTS. Righteousness is so misunderstood, in that many understand it on their own doing. Martin Luther renewed the Scriptural witness that Christ's righteousness is something freely given by grace through faith. That is the wonderous truth of the Reformation.

BIBLE STUDY Prophets were sometimes called "seers" (1 Samuel 9:9). As leaders became apostate (Amos 7:10–17) and the people strayed from God's Word and so the word of the Lord was rare (2:12b). Prophets often were to bring about reformation in Israel and unsettle the status quo, challenging God's people to wrestle with the Word and their life of faith.
