Last Sunday of the Church Year

Matthew 25:44 – “Then they also will answer, saying, ‘Lord, when did we see you hungry or thirsty or a stranger or naked or sick or in prison, and did not minister to you?’ ” With this parable Jesus once again emphasizes that our good works come from who we are, not the other way around. Sheep do sheep works, and goats do goat works. So, first things first. If we want to live more faithfully, let us come to Jesus, receive His gifts, and ask him to increase our faith.

(As a prayer of preparation use one of today's hymns the prayers inside the front cover of the hymnal.)

WELCOME GUESTS. The Eucharist is one of the names used for the Lord's Supper, and it means “Thanksgiving.” There is every reason to lift up our hearts in thanksgiving as Jesus gives us Himself in His body and blood. Jesus also gives in His Word that those who partake together are unified in doctrine and faith. Guests and visitors desiring to commune are asked to please speak with the pastor before the service.

BIBLE STUDY will continue a look at Thanksgiving as we delve into a review of the Small Catechism of the Common Table Prayers (surprisingly perhaps, not Come, Lord Jesus), the 1st Article of the Creed, the petition of the Lord's Prayer of daily bread, and more as we prepare to give thanks not just once a year but in our daily lives. We will self-lead for now and rejoice in the conversation and discussion.

SUNDAY SCHOOL As the narrative continues from Genesis, the people of Israel were in Egypt but then enslaved. As Egypt forgets the Lord, Pharaoh seeks to have God's children captive and even killed. But God saves Moses with an ark, A BASKET OF HOPE, so that he may later serve as God's servant as the Lord saves His people.
